## Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

### CERT Participates In Cal Tech Earthquake and Tsunami Seminars

CERT members have recently been invited to participate in Cal Tech's "Alliance for Earthquake Research Group". This is a regional advisory partnership emergency personnel and scientists. Included are leading scientists in the earthquake and tsunami field from Cal Tech and other institutions such as the USGS. The participants cover the gamut of emergency preparedness from

throughout southern California, including Office of emergency Preparedness, Fire, Police, DWP, Edison, and the news media.

The topic for this month was tsunami dynamics. A response to tsunami risks is currently in a planning stage.



The recent Sumatran disaster spurred a redrawing of contingency plans by regional experts. The Peninsula CERT plans to take up tsunami preparedness and education in future

meetings.

Experts at Cal Tech have also offered to give a public presentation on Tsunamis and Earthquakes. Watch The Pelican, the median signs, and the Web Site for dates to be announced.

#### First Aid/Earthquake preparedness Kits at Vons

Von's Market (on Ocean) has a supply of American Red Cross First Aid kits in back packs for sale. The packs are perfect for having a widely distributed net of medical gear for our CERT disaster contingency plans. They are the same kits sold by the Red Cross, but available right down the street! They'd be handy for our family needs as well, and are light and portable. I spoke to the manager who told me Von's is participating with the Red Cross in a disaster awareness month.

You can find them by the front door. Look to the left of the check out registers as you walk in the store.

Please urge your neighbors to obtain a kit as well. Should the need arise, our neighborhood would be better prepared

## Peninsula Improvement Committee Report

### Median: Funding Nearly Reaches Top Lighting Addressed

The final solicitation for the Median Project has occurred. If you still need a donation envelope they are available in a box on the sidewalk at my house: 5900 Bayshore Walk. We are almost to \$200,000!

The landscaping, lighting and control box installation that are not finished will begin soon. Salco, SCE, and City Light and Power are working to get the electrical problems ironed out. We are still waiting on some "as built" from the City! We can't wait to finish!

Additional lighting will be added, first, to the big parking lot at 72<sup>nd</sup>. If more lighting in that area is needed for safety the smaller lot lighting will be increased.

#### Beach Cleaning Schedules for Summer

- The Bayside trashcans are emptied on T & TH Seaside on M, W & Fri.
- Bayside walks will be swept on TH
- Bayside sand raking is 2 times or more per week
- All schedules are flexible due to equipment condition, special project occurrences, and environmental issues.

#### Peninsula Improvement Committee (PIC) Meeting

Peter Gadd gave presentation on report to be finished in 30 days-Beach Re-nourishment/Groins - Studied measurements 1/04 vs 2/05 with renourishment having occurred in between.

Groins made of 20 plastic bags each surveyed height of bags and height of sand on each side of groin. Settling into sand 1' to 2'; some bags broken below and some above water line due to vehicles, drift wood, gravel. Rate of erosion substantially fell in 1/05 vs. 1/04.

Interim conclusion-working. Wants input from local knowledge prior to final report. Next meeting City will have had opportunity to review report and will be presented to PIC.

\*Wooden groin removal at 68<sup>th</sup> Place - City believes this is remnants of old pier and does not have resources to remove.

•Parking Lots 72<sup>nd</sup> Place - Lighting will be increased by 5/6 at the end lot only. If this works will not do further west lot wanting not to disturb neighbors. Discussed directed lighting/screened lighting of western lot and Dennis Eschen will investigate.

•Tideland Funds-Issue:Keep Peninsula from sinking once oil drilling ceases. Mark Sandoval is obtaining a report and will present at the next meeting. Dennis Eschen is asking Curtis Hendersen of Oil Properties to come to the meeting after we hear from Mark Sandoval.

•Trash receptacles 72<sup>nd</sup> Place - 2 large cans will be in place by June 5.

•Trash receptacles Bayside - Only 1 can at the end of each street from October through May as experiment. City will investigate painting some label on cans "For Beach Use Only".

•Berm - Brig inquired as to reason for 5' high berm on bayside and was told one time delivery of sand for berm and renourishment. Will not happen again.

•Army Corp of Engineers is performing a study of the peninsula beach erosion beginning 10/05

### 4th of July Fireworks?

The following is a reminder from the Long Beach 4th of July Educational Campaign regarding the dangers of fireworks. Please read for the safety of all the children in our community.

#### **There's Nothing Cool About Fireworks**

##### **The Danger:**

A pretty sparkler burns at a whopping 1,800 degrees Fahrenheit. It's not a safe toy to put in a child's hand, or an adult's. No firework is. Fireworks are unpredictable. They spit hot sulfur and can unexpectedly explode. They can burn limbs and ruin lives, and there's nothing cool about that.

##### **The Bottom Line:**

All fireworks, including safe and sane, are against the law in Long Beach. They have been for more than 50 years. The consequences of lighting any fireworks in Long Beach and you may spend six months in jail, pay a \$1,000 fine, or both.

##### **The Alternative:**

This July, over 50 dazzling firework displays (controlled by the hands of professionals who specialize in pyrotechnics) will be held

throughout the County. The City of Long Beach encourages everyone to view fireworks in this safe manner. Please check local newspapers for location and times

4. Frequent surveys to residents and ABBPG members to obtain feedback about various issues affecting our neighborhood that require City support and/or resources.
5. Ongoing interaction and communications with various City departments to ensure public safety, neighborhood cleanliness, maintenance of our public areas and beaches.
6. Continuation of the Median Beautification Project which is slated for completion by Spring 2005.
7. Ongoing communication with the Long Beach Police Department to ensure public safety and security on the Peninsula.
8. Monitoring of building code enforcement by our Zoning Committee.
9. Improvement of street signage throughout the Peninsula.
