

## **The Ballot Box**



December 15th was the deadline for PBPG ballots to be received in order to be counted for the 2008 board member election. A large number of ballots were received, either by mail or at the PBPG drop-box. The election committee, which is made up of 3 non-candidate board members and an outside former Board member observer, met on December 18 to count the ballots and certify the election. The results are that the following list of candidates were elected to the PBPG board for a two year term. The board

members elected were Stevie Anderson, Jo Anne Arthur, Rob Bellevue, Lynne Driscoll, Sharon Kemmer, Linda McCullough, and Jeanne Muench (in alphabetical order). We congratulate those who were elected but also we thank very much the other candidates who ran for the office including their willingness to serve on the board had they been elected.



## *Status: Peninsula and Naples Underground Utilities study:*

Finally some preliminary estimates have been received from our consultant for review of both the Peninsula Underground Utility Committee and the Naples Improvement Association. The Toledo undergrounding project is going to go ahead by themselves as soon as they can get started with fewer than 34 homes. If the residents of both communities approve the estimates that will be circulated, a joint bond will be issued for a joint assessment district to underground the utilities in both communities. Joining together of these two communities will save on bond costs. The Toledo Project will be the first undergrounding of utilities in the City of Long Beach by private homeowners. Making our neighborhoods safer, better looking, and providing new an improved service to our community will be a big improvement to the Peninsula and to Naples, **IF APPROVED BY THE PROPERTY OWNERS.**

Property owners will have the option to pay upfront saving assessment amortization costs or to pay over 15-20 years with property taxes.

### Security on the Peninsula

The scam currently reported in Long Beach and on the Peninsula is house-to-house magazine subscription salesmen. These are usually young men. An organization in LA drops them off in various parts of Long Beach, as well as other cities, with fake business licenses. Some of the salesmen are friendly and some are not and all can become aggressive if they aren't meeting their quota of sales. Once you open your door to them, there is nothing between them and the inside of your house except you. LYPD has warned residents not to open their door to unknown persons since there have been incidents of assault and robbery.

### Alamitos Bay and Marine Notes:

The refurbishment of the seawall at 61<sup>st</sup> Place and Bayshore Walk is scheduled for completion by the end of 2008.

Installation of the new sand bag groins planned for the ocean beach from 62<sup>nd</sup> to 66<sup>th</sup> has been deferred until the Corps of Engineers completes their study of Peninsula beach erosion mitigation options. The Corps is currently finalizing the financial analysis section of the study.
