### Earthquake and Emergency Preparedness Meeting

Wednesday, August 19<sup>th</sup> @ ABYC  
6:30PM Social; 7:00PM Program

This will be a special program lead by the American Red Cross who will **provide Earthquake and Emergency Preparation Instructions and Information**. These persons are experts in how to prepare yourselves for this eventuality should it occur. Remember, the Long Beach Fire Department has already advised that they may not be able get to the Peninsula in a minimum of 3 days and maybe more. Therefore we need to provide for ourselves. The Red Cross will display **Preparedness Supply Kits** with all the essentials for preparedness. In addition there will also be a demonstration of **Emergency Radio Operation**. The is presentation is by the Peninsula CERT team.

Prepare to come, you will find it very worthwhile!!

**Who To Call**

The Board of the Peninsula Beach Preservation Group is organized to work on projects that would be difficult or impossible for individual residents to complete. We were responsible for extending the trees on the bay into peninsula waters; the tremendous improvement to the median planting on Ocean Blvd; the summer concert series and Santa’s visit to the peninsula each December. Our current major project is working with the city to go through the necessary steps to study the costs of putting our electricity, phone and cable service underground.

We get calls on a regular basis about issues about things that individual residents could handle on their own, such as dogs on the beach, noisy neighbors. We’re not an enforcement organization, but rather a charitable organization attempting to make improvements to the Peninsula, where possible.

**PENINSULA IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE**

**EAST END RESTROOM REPLACEMENT:** For public safety and hygiene, rest rooms are being replaced throughout the Long Beach Marine areas with a standard design prefabricated building. When it came to the rest room at the east end of the Peninsula, however, the City is planning to retain the historic Spanish architecture but yet provide a new floor plan meeting current public safety and hygiene requirements. The project is due for Plan check in this summer. Construction is scheduled to start later this summer.

**BEACH RENOURISHMENT:** Beach re-nourishment is complete for this summer using entirely our own sand. Re-nourishment will occur approximately every 6 months. Berms have been adjusted as much as can be allowed by the City budget. They were reconfigured for July 4<sup>th</sup>. The Groin approach, once approved, may proceed. However, this item was on City list but \$10 million was taken from tidelands budget, and this item was struck off the list.

**BEACH TRASH CANS:** Changing out to heavy plastic bins is in process as the metal ones are rusting. There will be the same barrel style with lid. City is contacting the Conservation Corps for putting and maintaining recycle bins on the beach.

**LEEWAY REPLACEMENT:** Public comment, mainly expressed in the PBPG General Meeting of May 06, has been largely in favor of design consistent with existing architecture. This is being taken into account for the final design. The budget for this item is on hold with the current financial situation; but the City will proceed with obtaining a cost estimate so that when money does come available the replacement will proceed with minimum delay.

No Action will be taken at this Study Session!

**Water Condition in our Bay:**

The Annual Heal the Bay scorecard came out recently and that report gave A and B grades to much of our recreational waters. The statement was again made that any waters that are located where major upland drainage occurs still have unsatisfactory ratings. These poor ratings will remain until methods are used to filter and remove, principally upstream, pollution from our water. What goes into our sewers comes out in our oceans!

**4<sup>th</sup> of July Report:**

The Peninsula seemed to be in a much better condition this year due to much better police patrols on both sides of the Peninsula and the soft closure at the beginning of the Peninsula. Portable Potties were provided by the City in an attempt to reduce public urination on private property. This also was an improvement and we hope will be tried again next year with just one toilet at street ends instead of two.

**Security:** Peninsula residents, especially those living on Ocean Blvd., continue to think of ways to make Ocean Blvd. safer for pedestrians, children, bicyclists and those drivers entering Ocean Blvd. from garages, alleys and side streets. A resident has come up with an original idea that will encourage faster traffic to use the center (median) lane while preserving the right hand lane for those driving 25 MPH, thus providing safer conditions for those folks noted above. The concept is to provide speed tables in the right hand lane only which would be designed to permit continuous 25MPH speed without having to slow down at each table. Those that wish to exceed the speed limit could still do so in the center lane with reduced hazard to

pedestrians, etc.

This concept also addresses prior objections of the Fire Department to any form of speed control since a full lane is left unrestricted. The idea was presented to the City Traffic Engineer who agreed that it is novel. Although he is considering the ramifications of the idea, he didn't see any major technical concerns. It is important to understand that speed **tables**, as opposed to bumps, can be designed to allow continuous traffic flow at predetermined speeds (for example, 25MPH) without having to slow down at the table. We hope you will give this serious thought before forming an opinion.
